Dear Parents,

I am writing this letter to address any concerns you may have regarding COVID-19 and Noli. We are now in week four and we have not had any confirmed cases of a student or teacher having COVID-19 thus far. We have had students who have stayed home due to siblings who have been exposed at other schools. If this happens to one of your children, please have your child stay home and follow all CDC guidelines as it pertains to vaccinated and non-vaccinated quarantine stays.

I understand that there have been several rumors about COVID on campus. I want all of our families to know that letters, emails, and phone calls, will be made if we ever have a potential exposure. Should we have more than 1 household with a positive case at the school, we will enact our safety protocols and shut down the campus for no less than 10 days. During that time, we will transition to online learning.

We continue to clean each classroom and common areas daily and we COVID spray/deep clean the school twice a week. Masks are required to be worn in class, and students may take them off when outside. All busses are sanitized every time students disembark.

Our goal is to give our students face to face instruction in the safest form possible. We ask all parents to keep their student home if they are feeling sick. We understand that the flu, colds, and sinus issues are common this time of year and they all have symptoms similar to COVID. Students who are in quarantine due to possible exposures will not have their absences counted against them.

The school is using goggle classroom for all assignments, so students will be able to keep up with their work while out. The spread of the virus will be something we will be dealing with throughout the school year. We are committed to keeping everyone updated as situations arise to cut down on any confusion.
